Job Description:

Your job will either be Food & Beverage, Housekeeping, or Retail. Position will be assigned upon arrival. Efforts will be made to place employees in their first job choice but this is not a guaranteed. Individual job duties will be given once position has been assigned.

HOUSEKEEPERS perform cleaning duties to maintain guest rooms and/or public hallway areas. Guest rooms may include: bedrooms, toilet/shower area, kitchen, living area, fireplace, and deck/porch. Job duties may include: Removing and collecting linens for laundering, cleaning rugs and upholstered furniture using vacuum cleaner, dusting furniture, emptying trash cans, cleaning floors with brooms, mops and vacuum cleaners, using chemical based cleaners for the bathrooms, including cleaning toilets and replenishing trash bags.

FOOD AND BEVERAGE jobs could include Bussing, Server, Dishwashing, or Cook/Prep Cook. COOKS/PREP COOKS do much of the preparation for the dishes that are served. This includes washing and chopping vegetables, weighing and mixing ingredients, storing food, and more. You will report to the head chef, and will be asked to prepare food items in the kitchen.

HOST/HOSTESS jobs are responsible for many things. You'll need to cheerfully greet guests, take them to their table and provide them with silverware and a menu. You'll also need to keep track of which tables are cleaned and available for new guests, and you may even be required to answer the phone, take

reservations and in some cases take-out orders.

SERVERS need to effectively take and deliver food and beverage orders, quickly take all food orders with the kitchen, Answer questions about cooking methods, menu items, specials and prices of all items, prepare and deliver beverage and dessert choices, make sure that appearance, temperature and portions are correct and deliver food orders in a timely fashion, collect payment, clean, clear and reset dining room tables.

AS a BUSSER, you will clean tables, remove plates, utensils and cups from the table and bring them to the kitchen to be washed. You will refill water glasses, reset tables for next guests, help waiters/waitresses to bring food to the table, restock all restaurant items, and help with other dining room needs. Bussers need customer service skills, and make sure waiters and waitresses can focus on the diners and make sure that food comes out in a speedy manner.

A RETAIL position you sell merchandise to guests. Responsibilities include: Handling sales in an accurate manner which will include maintaining a daily bank, entering sales in a cash register, taking money, counting out correct change, giving change (coins/bills), completing credit card transactions, wrapping items and put into bags, greeting all guests as they enter the store, assist guests on their purchases, stocking merchandise items, clean all retail areas including display areas, floors, and cash register/check-out area, Demonstrate a high level of customer service.

Students must arrive on Tuesdays ONLY by 12:00 pm into St. George to secure transportation to Zion National Park Lodge. Please arrange pick up with your employer prior to arrival. Tuesday is your arrival date, and is the date on your Job Offer Form.

Students must arrive at the Shuttle Stop or Greyhound Bus Station in St. George, Utah via a shuttle van service that leaves right from the Las Vegas airport.

You must inform your employer of the transportation type from Las Vegas that you use so your pickup location can be confirmed at either the Greyhound Station or Shuttle Pick up. If you need overnight accommodations in Las Vegas we suggest that you stay overnight somewhere close to the airport. Students should book a flight to Las Vegas and then take a bus (please be careful at the bus station it could be a dangerous place) or a shuttle to St. George.
